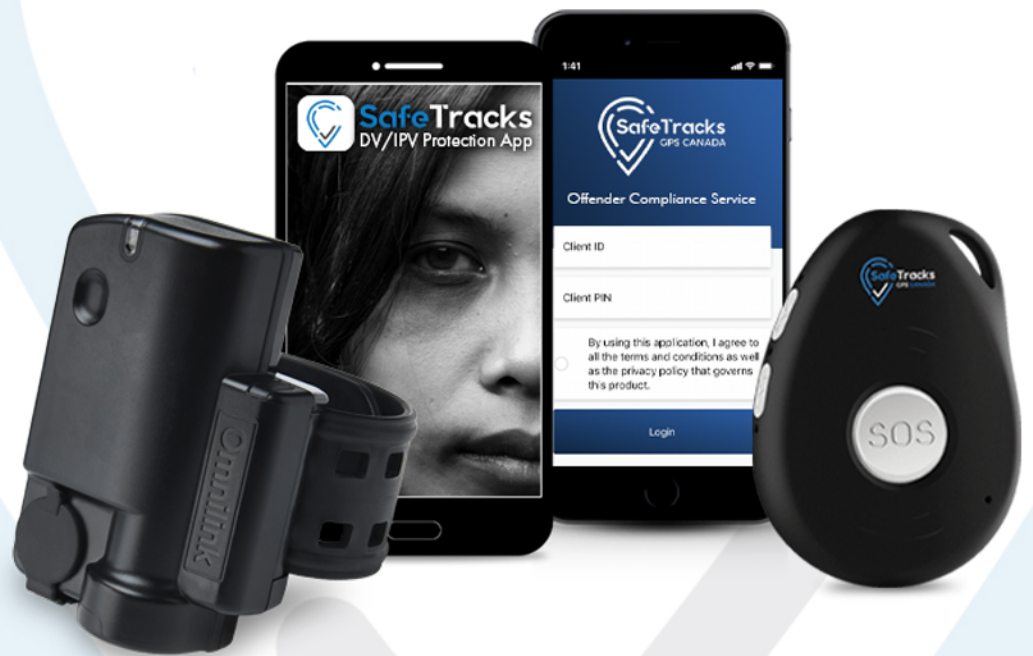

There is an opportunity for incarcerated individuals to apply to the courts to be released under conditions of house arrest on a SafeTracks GPS Ankle Bracelet. Authorization is reflected both in the relevant legislation and through Court rulings upholding it as an appropriate tool under the generic 'other reasonable conditions' provisions. Defense Lawyers can petition the courts or releasing authority for their clients to be released on conditions that incorporate the use of GPS Electronic Monitoring for the Release of an individual for one of the following applications:

- **Bail** (judicial interim release) - An order made to release a person prior to an official case disposition (pre-trial or pre-sentencing/appeal) or enforcement (deportation/extradition).
- **Sentencing** - A kind of non-custodial court ordered case disposition (conditional discharge, probation, conditional sentence). Sentences of two years or more are served in federal penitentiaries while sentences of less than two years are served in provincially administered prisons. Persons denied bail are held in 'remand' facilities which are also provincially administered.
- **Conditional Release** - A statutorily authorized early release from a court ordered sentence (temporary absence, parole, statutory release, long term offender order).
- **Preventive Orders** - Also known as 'peace bonds', this circumstance is a tailored court order and are based on a historical preventive authority that is available on defined evidentiary grounds to prevent the commission of harm, including in DV or threats of DV circumstances.

As per this introduction to the SafeTracks Private Rental Program, SafeTracks will provide all documentation required to make sure your experience to seek conditional release for your client is seamless. Such a program has shown to assist with rehabilitation, allows your client to continue to work and support their families, and limits your client's exposure to potentially worse behaviors and habits, all the while creating an environment of accountability.

While we are always prepared to testify if required, we respectfully encourage counsel to use these materials, our answers to questions provided in advance, and balanced agreed statements of fact as the evidence relating to our programs. When testimony is required, we encourage counsel to consider requesting that the court permit us to provide testimony by telephone or video, when required. **The fee for this is \$350.00 for the first hour, and \$100.00 per hour thereafter.**

We provide this information to assist the Participant and their counsel in determining whether to include our program in a proposed plan, to assist the Crown in determining its position, and to assist the court.

In the following sections, we present information that is common to our criminal law program regardless of which technology is used, summaries of how each of our technologies works, and information intended to assist in the creation of conditions when monitoring is being made part of an order.

We will provide the Crown with evidence to support a revocation, breach, variation, or treatment proceeding at no cost to the Crown, including testimony if required.

SafeTracks GPS Ankle Bracelet Private Rental Program – Technology & Actions

SafeTracks Private Rental Program utilizes the most modern Electronic Monitoring Innovation that is available around the world. Once the SafeTracks GPS Ankle Bracelet is affixed to the Participant, the essential functions are available, which include:

- a) SafeTracks Private Rental Program use a one-piece GPS Offender Monitoring Device (hereinafter referred to as the “Monitoring Device”) to monitor and track Participants released on Court Ordered Electronic Monitoring. The Monitoring Device is a hardened plastic encased leg cuff which incorporates strapping with embedded fiber-optics. The Monitoring Device tracking and monitoring system is attached to the cuff. The Participant must charge the monitoring device daily.
- b) The Monitoring Device tracks the Monitoring Device movements in real time. The Participant is monitored 24 hours per day, 7 days per week, 365 days per year. It works in conjunction with the SafeTracks/Northern 911 24/7/365 **“LIVE MONITORING CENTRE”** and the Software (hereinafter referred to as the “Monitoring Service”).
- c) If the Participant violates any of the Court Ordered release conditions related to wearing the electronic monitoring, the Monitoring Service will activate any and all of our predetermined protocols.
- d) Breach Alerts are displayed on the SafeTracks GPS Electronic Monitored Software’s Dashboard where our Monitoring Centre Team will be able to action them as per the Protocols. If requested or required, the SafeTracks GPS Electronic Monitoring Software will generate Alerts to whomever is deemed necessary to receive these Alerts, via Email/SMS. The interested parties may include the following:
 - Probation Officer
 - CBSA
 - Police or legal representative
 - Defense Council
 - Crown Prosecutor

e) The SafeTracks GPS Electronic Monitoring Software will generate a Breach Alert that will be actioned by the SafeTracks professional monitoring team and their agents. These Breach Alerts are actioned in conjunction with the Court Ordered Release Condition. We take those and create “Protocols”. These Alerts and Protocols are as follows:

EVENT	PROTOCOLS
LOW BATTERY	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At 30% battery, the ankle monitor will vibrate for 2minutes, prompting immediate charge • Below 20%, it issues a voice alert: “Battery alert. Charge immediately.” • SafeTracks Monitoring is notified and allows 60 minutes for charging. • If uncharged, they call the participant, advise charging, and wait another 60 minutes. • If still uncharged, they call again and wait 30 more minutes. • If there is no response, the police are then notified. • SafeTracks informs relevant parties of the breach and actions taken
EXCLUSION ZONE ENTERED	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • When an Exclusion Zone is entered, the SafeTracks Monitoring Center alerts the nearest local law enforcement and requests a police response. The center will then call the Participant, instructing them to leave the area immediately. • SafeTracks to notify interested parties of the breach and of the actions taken.
EXCLUSION BUFFER ZONE ENTERED	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • When entered, the SafeTracks Monitoring center will call the Participant and instruct them to leave the area immediately.
FAILED TO ENTER INCLUSION ZONE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If the Participant fails to enter a designated Inclusion zone, the SafeTracks Monitoring center will run an instant locate on the ankle monitor to verify that the device is not within the inclusion zone. • If the GPS coordinates are not within the zone, the SafeTracks Monitoring center will call the local law enforcement closest to the Participant’s location and request a police response. • SafeTracks to notify interested parties of the breach and actions.
UNAPPROVED LEAVE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If the participant leaves the Home Inclusion Zone without authorization, the SafeTracks Monitoring Center will verify the device’s location. • If outside the zone, the participant will be contacted and instructed to return home. • After five minutes, a second location check will be performed. If noncompliant, the local law enforcement will be notified. • SafeTracks will inform relevant parties of the breach and actions taken.

EVENT	PROTOCOLS
STRAP TAMPER	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If the ankle monitor detects any form of tampering with its strap, the SafeTracks Monitoring center will be notified and will call the nearest police department to the location of the Participant and request an immediate police response. • SafeTracks to notify interested parties of the breach and of the actions taken.
DEVICE TAMPER	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If the ankle monitor detects any form of tampering, the SafeTracks Monitoring center will be notified and will call the nearest local law enforcement to the location of the Participant and request an immediate police response. • SafeTracks to notify interested parties of the breach and of the actions taken.
COMMUNICATION LOSS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If the ankle monitor stops transmitting location data, the SafeTracks Monitoring Center and its agents will begin diagnosing the issue and work to restore communication with the device. • If communication cannot be restored, the Monitoring Center will contact the nearest police department to the device's last known location and request a police response. • SafeTracks will notify all relevant parties.

- f) In addition to GPS, the Monitoring Centre also has the ability to communicate with the Monitoring Device, Text to Voice communication that allows SafeTracks Operators and Agency Officers to contact the Participant at any time providing real time intervention and monitoring. It also incorporates an onboard 90 dB Siren. The SafeTracks Monitoring Centre as part of a violation protocol, or agency officers via the software, can activate the Siren. It can assist Police Officers with Offender recovery and improves public safety.
- g) If the Participant is released with Court Ordered Electronic Monitoring, then the Participant must sign a Consent and Release of Personal Information that allows SafeTracks and our strategic partners to provide to Law Enforcement Agencies including, but not limited to, Canada Justice, All Provincial and Territorial Justice Department of Justice-Canada, the RCMP, INSET, Local and City Policing Authorities, Provincial, Municipal and First Nations' Police Services, Canadian Border Services Agency (CBSA), and Canada Customs and Revenue Agency (CCRA) with the Participant's personal information.
- h) The Participant's personal information is any audio, visual, or written recorded information about the Participant including, but not limited to, times, dates, and location of the Participant, information provided by the Participant on the GPS Electronic Monitoring Service Intake Form, any definitions included in s.1 (n) of FOIP, and any and all other information which may be recorded, collected, or stored by SafeTracks in connection with the GPS Electronic Monitoring relative to the Participant.

- i) In the SafeTracks GPS Monitoring Software, Electronic Geo-Zones can be created and stored on the GPS Ankle Bracelet and the SafeTracks Monitoring Software. 300 Zones can be created which are commonly referenced to as Inclusion Zones, where the Participant “MUST” remain within, or an Exclusion Zone, where the Participant is “NOT” allowed to enter. All these Geo-Zones can be programmed to maintain compliancy and accountability 24/7/365. These Geo-Zones can be scheduled to allow the Participants to “LEAVE” an Inclusion Zone, when approved.
- j) SafeTracks can set a digital perimeter around a residential, office, school, work, family properties to monitor Court Ordered Protection Orders. If the Participant Violates this perimeter, this will trigger a Breach Alert, whereas the Monitoring Service will contact the nearest local law enforcement to dispatch and apprehend. These are called Exclusion Zones. They can be used for Intimate Partner Violence (IPV), Witness Protection, or High-Risk Sexual Offenders.
- k) If the Participant is Court Ordered to have the Monitoring Device installed before their release from a remand center, then a representative from SafeTracks, can attend the remand center and have the device installed before release. We have the capabilities to install Monitoring Devices Canada wide.
- l) If the Participant attempts to Tamper with the GPS Monitoring Device, the SafeTracks Monitoring Service will immediately report this to the closet police as a violation of the Release Order and request the Police to be dispatched.
- m) The SafeTracks Monitoring Service when required to contact Police Departments across Canada, utilizes the PUBLIC SAFETY ANSWERING POINT (PSAP). PSAP is a Call Centre Service where Emergency Calls for Police, Fire or Ambulance are sent. In the case of our Monitored Devices, the initial alert/call comes into our Monitoring Service and once the address is received and validated, the PSAP for that address is determined and the call is connected via PRIMARY TRUNKS to the Police of jurisdiction via 3-way conference.
- n) The Monitoring Device uses the Global Positioning System (GPS) to record its location every 60 seconds. This collected data is then sent to the servers every 3 minutes, this Data then provides a continual record of the locations of the Participant throughout the day. The Monitoring Device communicates with SafeTracks servers using Cellular communication. SafeTracks uses SIM technology with prominent Canadian Cellular providers. The Monitoring Device transmits and receives information to and from a specified server on the internet by way of the cellular GSM network using GPRS (General Packet Radio Service.) All transmitted information is securely encrypted, including location records, alarm notifications, configuration data and remote alert commands sent to the device from the server. The transmitted data would include, but not limited to, location, GPS strength, Cellular Connectivity, Battery Levels, Breach Alerts.
- o) The GPS accuracy is 3ft - 5ft (1.5m) in optimal conditions (outdoors) and 30ft - 50ft (15m) under normal operations. The ankle monitor uses GPS signal as the primary, Wi-Fi as a secondary location technology and Cellular Triangulation when the GPS signal is lost. This method relies on the strength of signals from nearby cell towers. The device calculates its location based on the distance to multiple cell towers, with more towers in range improving the accuracy. However, the accuracy of cellular triangulation can vary, typically ranging from several hundred meters to a few kilometers, depending on the availability and strength of the cellular signal.

- p) Expected variations in accuracy and completeness do not compromise the system's capacity to monitor compliance with typical geographic restrictions and to establish a record of the wearer's movements. If there are specific questions or concerns about how accuracy and completeness may impact a particular case, we would be happy to address them.
- q) Our Monitoring Device has been utilized to monitor Participants across Canada with a variety of high-profile charges including but not limited to:
- Murder and Attempted Murder
 - Trafficking and Organized Crime
 - Terrorism-related offenses
 - Fraud and Financial Crimes
 - Exploitation Offences

SafeTracks GPS Ankle Bracelet Technology – Consequences and Concerns

- It is our understanding that, in bail cases, courts will be considering Electronic Monitoring in two distinct stages - firstly, as part of the court's assessment of whether a proposed plan sufficiently mitigates case-specific concerns and, secondly, if the court makes a release order, deciding what conditions are appropriate. This section is intended to assist in both of those stages and their counterparts in other contexts, such as conditional sentences, peace bonds, early release, and immigration release.
- Electronic Monitoring cannot prevent flight or non-compliant behaviour, nor can it guarantee any specific police response time. Where we present information about typical response times, it is provided for completeness, but we do not recommend that decisions be based on an expectation of any specific police response time. The ultimate police response time can vary due to a number of factors, including technical or human factors delaying the time between the event, the system's communication of an alert, the steps taken between the time the alert is received and making a report to police, police priorities at the time of the report, and time necessary for police to arrive on scene. In other words, in our view, it is not practical to see Electronic Monitoring's risk mitigation impact as deriving from any ability to stop a person from fleeing or committing an offence that endangers public safety. Consistent with our reading of the case law, we recommend that monitoring's impact be assessed in terms of its expected deterrent effect on a specific Participant person in relation to specific behaviours of concern and in terms of its ability to provide early detection and objective reporting of violations.
- When the court determines that there is a risk that a Participant could remove a SafeTracks GPS Ankle Bracelet in order to flee the jurisdiction or commit an offence, an important consideration is that - no matter how rapid the police response may be, it cannot be relied on to be rapid enough to locate and apprehend them.

GPS Monitoring Condition Considerations

- When the court determines that a Participant presents a risk to commit offences that endanger public safety, the following considerations may be helpful to bear in mind.
- As a result of the deterrent effect of the wearer knowing that a record is being kept of their location, to the extent that the court determines that such an effect can be expected to be operative in a specific case, GPS monitoring may offer risk mitigation value independently of other conditions such as a curfew or house arrest.

GPS Monitoring complete with Geo-Zone based restriction, such as a Curfew or House Arrest, with NO Exceptions:

- When a court determines that compliance with a house arrest or curfew condition is necessary to mitigate risk, GPS monitoring may support such conditions by bolstering the likelihood of compliance and reducing the risk associated with the possibility that the Participant was to breach such a condition. SafeTracks monitoring Centre, through their protocols, can and will contact local police if required, and advise them of the possible breach and request police response.
- Our GPS solutions will generate alerts when zone-based restrictions are violated. Our protocols state that we, if required, will contact the Police of Jurisdiction, and advise them that the Participant has Breached a Condition of their Release. All we can do is request them to dispatch.

Exceptions - Surety Accompaniment, Work, School, etc:

Whether an exception to a Geo-Zone-based restriction such as a House Arrest is Permissive, or Mandatory will affect the method and timing of how we detect and report non-compliance. We do not follow movements in real-time during a leave nor do we review the tracks immediately once the leave ends.

- **If an Exception is Mandatory** – We are able to set up a zone-based restriction that will result in violations being detected and reported in the same way as described above for violation of a house arrest or curfew.
- **If an Exception is Permissive** – Such as permitting the Participant to leave the residence in the company of a surety, or for specific purposes such as work or school, this will mean that a zone-based alert is not sufficient to detect non-compliance and may create the possibility that non-compliance will go undetected, that detection and reporting of such will be delayed, or that further police investigation may be needed. For all types of Permissive Exceptions, a manual review of the GPS tracks will be required to compare where and if they went for the permitted purpose.

Some examples of common **Permissive Exceptions** may include:

- a) **Special purpose exceptions such as work, school, meetings with counsel, medical appointments:** For these types of exceptions, only a manual review of the Participant's actual GPS tracks will be able to compare where they went with the permitted purpose.
- b) **Directly to and from/defined travel corridors:** Where consideration is being given to accompanying a permissive exception with a requirement that the Participant "travel directly to and from" the permitted location or that they only travel within a defined travel corridor, there are a few considerations that we suggest being borne in mind.

GPS records tracking will show brief deviations, like stopping for gas or using a drive-thru. We recommend considering whether these should be treated as breaches of the "directly to and from" requirement. When a permissive exception is accompanied by a defined travel corridor, we will create a zone reflecting the corridor's boundaries; however, if there are other concurrent exceptions, the manual review described above will still be required.

GPS – Exclusion Geo-Zones

- When terms require that the Participant is not to enter a defined area, we will set up an Exclusion zone that will result in violation alerts. SafeTracks monitoring center will contact the Police of Jurisdiction and request to be dispatched.
- We sometimes see terms prohibiting the Participant from being within a defined distance of places where named people live, work or attend school, without specifying the associated addresses. In the absence of specific addresses being provided, we are unable to establish exclusion zones within the monitoring system, which are essential for triggering alerts in the event of a breach; as such, the failure to supply this information materially limits our ability to fulfill monitoring obligations and compromises the effectiveness of the enforcement protocols.

GPS – Apartment Buildings or Offices:

- When a Participant lives in an apartment building, it should be borne in mind that the GPS monitoring cannot determine where the Participant is within the unit.

SafeTracks Court Ordered Release Condition Requirements:

SAFETRACKS provides these terms for the convenience of the Court and counsel. We will monitor in accordance with any terms ordered by the Court. These terms are for GPS monitoring - please adapt as needed.

- YOU SHALL BE SUBJECT TO A GPS ANKLE BRACELET AND MONITORING BY SAFETRACKS GPS CANADA (SAFETRACKS). THE ANKLE BRACELET SHALL BE INSTALLED BY A SAFETRACKS REPRESENTATIVE PRIOR TO YOUR RELEASE FROM CUSTODY.
- YOU SHALL ENTER INTO THE SAFETRACKS GPS PRIVATE RENTAL ELECTRONIC MONITORING PROGRAM, AND AGREEING BY SIGNATURE TO THEIR CONTRACT, SCHEDULES, RULES AND PROTOCOLS, AND CONSENTING TO THE RELEASE OF ALL PERSONAL INFORMATION AGREEMENT. YOU SHALL COMPLY WITH ALL TERMS OF THESE AGREEMENTS, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO:
 - WEARING A SAFETRACKS GPS ANKLE BRACELET AT ALL TIMES
 - COMMUNICATING WITH SAFETRACKS REPRESENTATIVES TO INSTALL, MONITOR AND MAINTAIN EQUIPMENT, COMMUNICATION SCHEDULE UPDATES AND ENFORCE PROTOCOLS.
 - PERMITTING SAFETRACKS REPRESENTATIVES INTO YOUR HOME TO INSTALL, MONITOR, AND MAINTAIN EQUIPMENT
 - COMPLYING WITH SAFETRACKS BATTERY CHARGING REQUIREMENTS
 - COMPLYING WITH SAFETRACKS PAYMENT SCHEDULE AND PROTOCOLS – ACCOUNT MUST BE MADE CURRENT WITHIN 15 DAYS OF RECEIPT.
- IF FOR ANY REASON THE SAFETRACKS ANKLE BRACELET EXPERIENCES MAINTENANCE, TECHNICAL ISSUES OR YOUR ACCOUNT FALLS IN FINANCIAL DEFAULT, YOU SHALL TURN YOURSELF INTO THE

CLOSEST RCMP DETACHMENT OR POLICE STATION ON THE REQUEST OF SAFETRACKS REPRESENTATIVES IMMEDIATELY, UNTIL THE ISSUE IS CORRECTED.

- YOU SHALL PROVIDE A COPY OF THIS RELEASE ORDER AND ANY VARIATIONS OF SUCH, TO SAFETRACKS FOR THE PURPOSES OF ENSURING COMPLIANCE WITH THIS ORDER.
- YOU SHALL PROVIDE THE NAME OF YOUR PROBATION OFFICER TO SAFETRACKS WITHIN 3 BUSINESS DAYS OF HAVING ONE ASSIGNED TO YOU.
- YOU SHALL NOT TAMPER WITH OR REMOVE THE SAFETRACKS GPS ANKLE BRACELET WITHOUT PRIOR JUDICIAL APPROVAL AND OR BY SAFETRACKS REPRESENTATIVE. FOR GREATER CERTAINTY, THE SAFETRACKS GPS ANKLE BRACELET MAY BE REMOVED IF YOU ARE PLACED BACK IN THE CUSTODY OF POLICE OR OTHER REMAND OR CORRECTIONAL FACILITY.
- YOU MUST LIVE AT YOUR APPROVED RESIDENCE [APPROVED ADDRESS]. ANY CHANGES IN YOUR ADDRESS MUST BE APPROVED IN WRITING BY YOUR PROBATION OFFICER, AND YOU MUST NOTIFY SAFETRACKS IMMEDIATELY.
- YOU MUST KEEP A CURFEW AND REMAIN IN YOUR HOME OR ITS GROUNDS 24 HOURS A DAY, 7 DAYS A WEEK. THESE EXCEPTIONS APPLY TO THE CURFEW RESTRICTION:
 - MEDICAL OR OTHER EMERGENCIES FOR YOU, YOUR SURETY, OR YOUR FAMILY.
 - TRAVEL TO, FROM AND WHILE REMAINING AT WORK, EDUCATION OR VOCATIONAL TRAINING. YOU MUST PROVIDE IN ADVANCE TO YOUR PROBATION OFFICER A COPY OF YOUR WORK / EDUCATION/ TRAINING SCHEDULE FOR AT LEAST ONE WEEK, WITHIN ONE BUSINESS DAY OF YOUR PROBATION OFFICER'S REQUEST.
 - ANY OTHER EXCEPTION APPROVED IN WRITING BY YOUR PROBATION OFFICER.
- PRESENT YOURSELF AT THE DOOR WHEN REQUESTED BY POLICE, SAFETRACKS AND OR ANY OF THEIR AGENTS. AND MUST FOLLOW ALL DIRECTIONS OF ANY OF THESE REPRESENTATIVES.
- FOLLOWING THE INSTALLATION OF THE ANKLE BRACELET ON MY PERSON, I AGREE TO TRAVEL DIRECTLY TO MY COURT ORDERED RESIDENCE AND NOT TO MAKE ANY STOPS ON THE WAY TO THAT RESIDENCE. I UNDERSTAND THAT THE COURT ORDERED RELEASE DOCUMENT IS IN EFFECT FROM STARTING AT THE TIME THE ANKLE BRACELET IS INSTALLED AND I LEAVE THE DETENTION CENTER.

PLEASE NOTE: FROM THE TIME WE RECEIVE THE SIGNED COURT ORDER, INSTALLATION AND RELEASE CAN TAKE UP TO 48 HOURS, MONDAY TO FRIDAY ONLY.

IF THE PARTICIPANT FAILS TO MAKE ANY PAYMENT OR CAUSES DAMAGES TO THE EQUIPMENT, THE SURETY OR GUARANTOR, ASSUMES RESPONSIBILITY FOR RENUMERATION TO SAFETRACKS. ADDITIONALLY, FAILURE TO KEEP THE ACCOUNT IN GOOD STANDING, WILL RESULT IN TERMINATION OF THE CONTRACT WITH SAFETRACKS.
